Finally I expect and seek all of your kind assistance and cooperation in achieving our vision of being the undisputed front-runner in the innovative and comprehensive healthcare by 2020


## **ABOUT US**

The Department of Medicine provides high quality full range of care from general health services to the most complex and specialized treatments, all within a sensitive and compassionate environment. The Department is arranged into two divisions, each consists of two wards. One unit takes responsibility for casualty admissions in every 24 hour period.

General Medicine Department houses 2 Consultant physicians and is responsible for 205 beds across four wards. In year 2011, the department performed over 70,000 outpatient encounters and had over 22,000 inpatient admissions.

The Diabetic clinic along with the newly established NCD Centre (previously diabetic Centre) offer comprehensive programs for non-communicable diseases that includes medical care and a diabetes self-management program with the aim of brining latest.

The General Surgery Department offers a comprehensive and high quality range of surgical procedures to the local community. A wide range of surgical procedures are undertaken as day and inpatient cases in addition to minor operations. From a relatively simple hernia operation to a more complex procedure, our surgeons are all guided by their dedication to providing the best possible outcome for their patients.

The department functions as two units headed by two General surgeons and patients are managed through 254 bedded wards with 12 acute beds. Casualty surgical patients are admitted to casualty surgical wards and transferred to surgical /post-surgical wards for further management.

The anesthesiology team at PGH Badulla provides patients with the most advanced anesthesiology and pain management options available. Our anesthesiology medical staff is involved in all aspects of surgical care, including preoperative evaluation, monitoring patients during surgery, and afterward in the recovery room. These specialists perform a wide range of procedures in all three main categories of anesthesia and provide peri-operative care for approximately 25,000 patients undergoing a variety of surgical procedures through three operating theatre units each year.

Our hospital has Surgical & Medical Intensive Care Units which provide advanced, personalized care for patients. Our 3-bed HDU is for patients with medical conditions that do not need intensive care, but do require specialized monitoring, nursing and resources.

The Department of Ophthalmology provides inpatient and outpatient eye care services for the hospital's catchment area in Uva province.

As the requirements continued to grow in volume and complexity during past years, the unit went through a number of upgrades during last few years to meet the expanding requirements. These upgrades, including eye clinic being moved to new spacious building, and contribution of dedicated, experienced team of consultant, medical officers and the supportive staff of the unit have ensured the maximum patient care to the community.

In year 2011, **37143** patients were seen at the eye clinic and it was an increase of 69% compared to 2009 and this has been made possible by conducting clinics from Monday to Saturday [ 6 days a week] and through the dedication of medical staff with the enthusiastic guidance of the consultant eye surgeon.




